<p>Study Programme</p>	<p>PH Luzern offers a special programme for its international students. Upon request, PH Luzern will organize school experiences in public or private schools (up to 6 ECTS).</p>	
<p>Accommodation</p>	<p>PH Luzern does not have on-campus housing and international students will need to make their own housing arrangements. However, PH Luzern has access to a limited number of student rooms for international students; our office will also gladly assist with information about other moderate-priced housing options.</p>	

Support and Cultural Experience	<p>Receiving a small number of Incoming Students per semester allows the International Office to take care of our guests on a very personal basis. The IO organizes two to three events per semester for its international students.</p> <p>By signing up through www.buddysystem.eu, incoming students can find a local student buddy who assists with getting to know university life and the new environment. Luzern has a local chapter of ESN Switzerland (http://esn.ch). It offers numerous events during the semester for all incoming students.</p>
Swiss Mobility Grant	<p>The federal Swiss European Mobility Programme (SEMP) supports students from partner institutions in Erasmus+ countries with a grant equivalent to the stipend paid through the Erasmus+ programme. Stipends are between CHF 380-440/month, depending on the country. Health Insurance	<p>Anyone staying in Switzerland must have insurance that fulfills the requirements of the Swiss Obligatory Healthcare Insurance Law. For students from EU countries, the European Health Insurance Card (EHIC) will be accepted.</p> <p>Students from Non-EU countries can apply for an exemption from compulsory Swiss insurance once they are here, by providing proof that their health insurance fulfills all the requirements set by Swiss law. Exemptions are rare, however, and students may have to purchase a policy that is accepted by Swiss authorities. A low-cost option student insurance policy that fulfills the requirements is offered by Swisscare: https://swisscare.com/</p>
Visa Residence Permit	<p>Nationals of EU/EFTA-countries: No visa required to enter Switzerland.</p> <p>Nationals of non-EU/EFTA countries: Check visa requirements with the Swiss Embassy in your country of residence (https://www.ch.ch/en/swiss-missions-abroad/). The embassy site generally posts a list of documents to bring along to the visa appointment. Schedule visa appointments early.</p> <p>Once in Switzerland, all students need to register with local authorities and get a Residency Permit from the Office of Migration of the Canton of Lucerne. (Cost: Registration with local authorities: CHF 35; Residence Permit: EU/EFTA nationals 70 CHF, Non-EU/EFTA CHF 250)</p>
Living Costs	<p>Students from partner universities do not pay tuition or semester fees.</p> <p>Estimated living costs for Lucerne, around 1500 CHF/month all included.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Registration with local authorities: CHF 35 - Residence Permit: EU/EFTA nationals 70 CHF, Non-EU/EFTA CHF 250 - Student accommodation: app. CHF 650 / month - Books and supplies: app. CHF 50 / month - Internet: free in university buildings and Student Houses - Mobile: depending on individual use, app. CHF 20 / month - Local transportation (not necessary if you buy a bike): CHF 80 / month - Health Insurance (not EU/EFTA): app. CHF 150 / month - Liability Insurance (may be required by lease): CHF 100 - Food (self-prepared): app. CHF 300-400 / month - Lunch at student Cafeteria: CHF 10 - Dinner at a Restaurant: app. CHF 30 - Beer / Coffee / Soft Drink: CHF 5-6
